- Young refugees
- under care of the City of Düsseldorf
- or registered by the KIB and waiting for a school place
- between 16 and 21 years old
- completed compulsory schooling

Quick-Start at a glance

- Language development
- 4 weeks skill assessment
- Development of individual prospects, recommendations are made for follow-up programmes, projects or schools
- Evaluation of individual skill sets for all participants

What is Quick-Start?

Quick-Start is divided into two parts :

1. Competence check

The participants are tested over a period of four weeks:

- Evaluation of language level (listening comprehension, reading, writing and speaking skills) and intensive language training
- Reasoning (knowledge of mathematics, learning/memorising, spatial awareness)
- Demonstration of manual skills (The practical seminar takes participants through four stations that enable them to expand their knowledge, their manual ability and motor skills)



2. Develop future prospects

Duration 1-2 months

Depending on the refugee status and the individual language skills, we evaluate the participants for their future prospects.

If an immediate assessment of the participants is not possible, we will try to find internships at the JBH so that they can accumulate some initial working experience here.

Possible prospects after training:

- Vocational guidance counselling
- Placement in an intensive German language training class
- Vocational preparation
- Vocational training



Quick-Start in Numbers:



- 36 hours during the week (Monday-Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Friday. 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.)
- 4 weeks skill assessment
- 1-3 month programme
- Limited to 12 participants
- 3 specialists on site (social worker, teacher, qualified trainer)
- Participants can enter the programme every Monday if places are available
